FOUNDING DOCUMENT

The charity was set up by means of a constitution that was accepted by the Office of the Scottish Regulator on 9 October 2017.

CHARITABLE PURPOSES

The charitable purposes of the Association are the advancement of education and the advancement of the arts, heritage, culture or science by providing a website, information, educational resources, talks and exhibitions about the Holocaust and the refugee experience to the general public, students and school children and by learning from testimonies of Holocaust survivors and refugees from Nazi persecution who have settled in Scotland.

ACTIVITIES

The Association had another busy and successful year in 2021. The continuance of the Covid pandemic prevented us from taking our exhibition to schools and from giving talks in person. However, we delivered a number of talks virtually and we have substantially expanded our online resources. In particular, in early 2021, we redesigned and greatly improved our website and, since then, we have attracted over 12,000 new visitors to the website. We have made a film about the refugee experiences of Steven Anson's father, which is freely available as a resource to be used by schools and other organisations, as are all our educational resources. We have made several podcasts. We have created two digital comics, one narrating the history of the Association and the other being a poem by Howard Singerman about his mother's sister, Marta, who was murdered at Auschwitz aged 12. We have presented online at Limmud, Hidden Treasures, an online conference hosted by the University of Sussex, the AJR Second Generation conference, the University of Glasgow and various schools. We have also been very active on Twitter. Since our Twitter account began in 2020, we have attracted 24,500 views.

There have been no changes in the trustees during the year.

TRUSTEES REMUNERATION AND EXPENSES

The Trustees received reimbursement of expenses of £1,229 during the year (2020: £625).

RESERVES

All of the Trust funds are unrestricted general funds and are used by the Trustees to further the work being carried out in accordance with the above charitable purposes.

INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT TO THE TRUSTEES

I report on the accounts for the year ended 31 December 2021 which are set out on pages 4 and 5.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner
